

Two Sisters Preserve

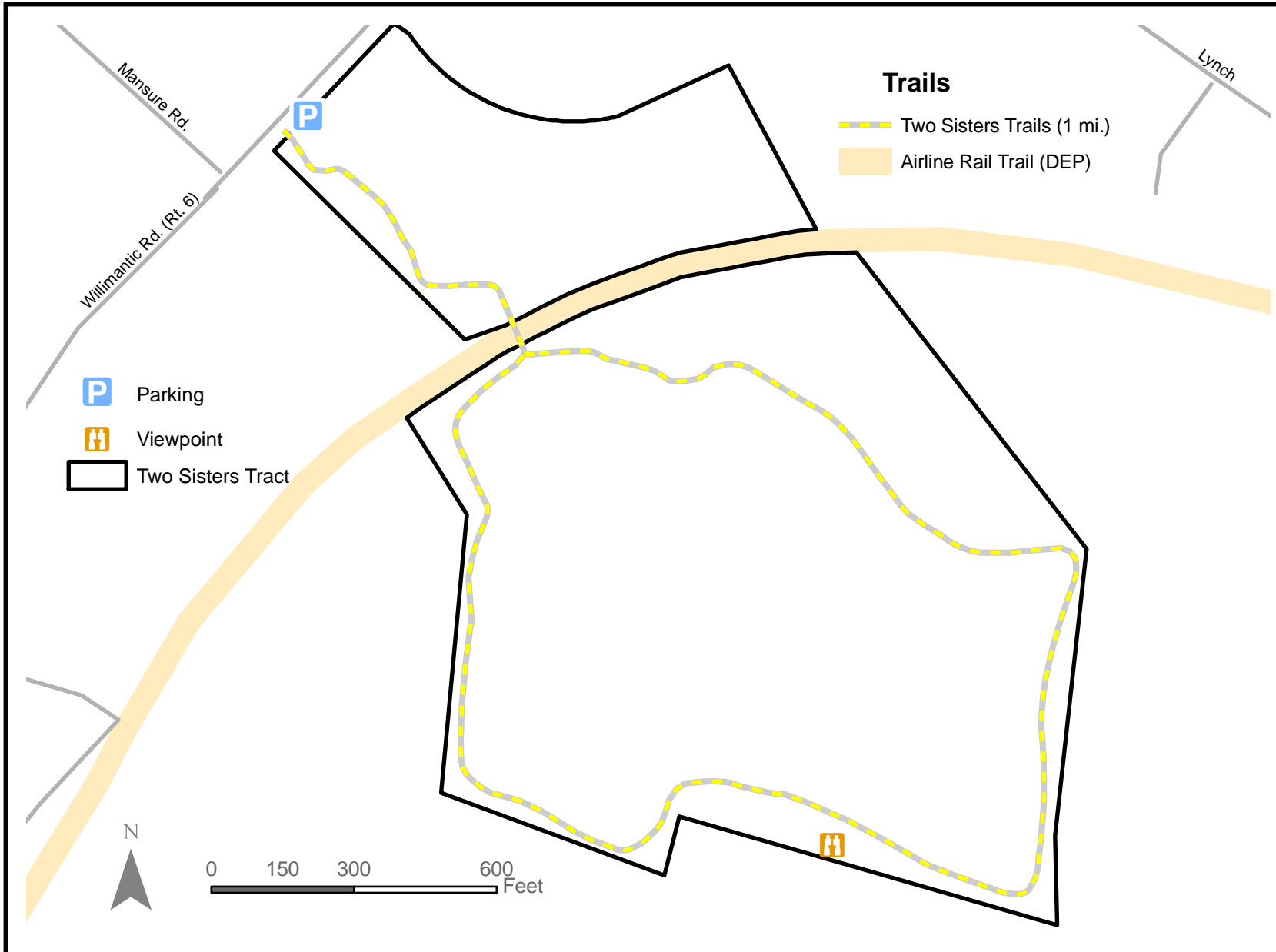
Chaplin, CT

The Two Sisters Tract is a 40-acre preserve that was donated to the Trust in 2001 by sisters, Elaine Mrusek and Josephine Krikorian. It straddles a section of the Airline Rail Trail and so is accessible to hikers along that trail as well as from Rt. 6. It is a wooded parcel that rises somewhat steeply to the Airline (there is a staircase on the Two Sisters trail) and then more gradually to the southern boundary where a rocky outcrop overlooks abutting woods. Because the neighboring land is actively hunted, visitors to Two Sisters are advised to wear blaze orange in hunting season.

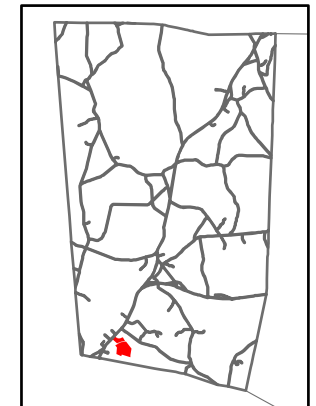
